


Our purpose






Five Guiding Principles of accompaniment

- 1. Expect the Holy Spirit's Presence
- 2. Stand Aside
- 3. Tune into the divine listening and discerning
- 4. Gradualness
- 5. Movement towards Human Flourishing







"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the LORD. Isaiah 55:8

- We 'stand aside', creating a sacred space, focused on the desire to listen to the working of the Spirit.
- We 'park' our own needs and agendas, lose our ego and pre-conceived judgements.

For a synodal Church communion | participation | mission



"Listen to his voice and harden not your hearts" Hebrews 3:15

- Our synodal meetings have as their deepest purpose the discernment of God's will.
- They are distinct from usual conversations or business meetings.
- We tune into the life of the Divine.



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"Time is greater than space" (Evangelii Gaudium, #222)

- We are free of the need to be focused on reaching a specific destination. The end is not ours to determine.
- We are humbly concerned with the next step within the movement of the Spirit.

For a synodal Church



"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD' Jer 29:11

- We focus on God's intent to see every human person flourish (fully alive).
- We notice (and celebrate) that the Spirit is alive and active
- Movement is always present. Perhaps small steps, or in a different direction than expected.
- It may appear, even in apparent stuckness!




Which 'archetypes' typically engage with activities in your parish? Which 'archetypes' don't engage very often?

ACROSS THE PARISH


- 1) Things looking, sounding and feeling different

Discernment

A synodal Church in proclaiming the Gospel, 'journeys together' – How is this journeying together happening and what steps might the Holy Spirit be inviting us to take?

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Discernment

Return to the main themes: What's our experience now? What's moved on?

Discern where the Spirit is inviting you to begin. (Gradual steps towards fulfillment.)

Discernment Meetings

- Open parish synodal meetings A series of small meetings
- A discernment group

What is the Spirit prompting us towards?

- Parish wide discernment
- Particular discernment individuals and groups

Lectio Divina



Lectio Divina "Look, here is the Lamb of God" "What are you looking for?" "Where are you staying?" "Come and See" "We have found the messiah" John 1:35-42

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What are you looking for?
Where have you seen the Lamb of God?
How are others in your community pointing you to the Messiah?
Who is inviting you to 'come and see' Jesus?
Where is Jesus residing in our community?
As a community where are we heading?

Lectio Divina

Spiritual conversation: Three rounds of listening



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Synodal meetings

NB - Not a business meeting Suggested format (General meeting or themed):

- 1. PRAYER
- 2. PREPARE: Reflect on the 5 Principles— How is this meeting different? How will we be today?
- 3. SYNODAL LISTENTING
 - See, Judge, Act Lectio Divina Spiritual conversation
- 4. How is this developed? Maintain commitment to a synodal approach

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Quick recap of possible steps

- Return to synod themes. Where do you begin?
- Synodal gatherings: parish wide or specific areas
- Synodal Listening communal discernment, leading to decision and action
- Maintain a commitment to synodal way of being
